## Entry requirements

### Current Year 12 applicants

- Applicants have completed Year 12 with an ATAR of 70 or above.

### Prerequisites

- Units 1 and 2: satisfactory completion in two units (any study combination) of Maths: General Mathematics, Maths: Mathematical Methods or Maths: Specialist Mathematics or Units 3 and 4: any Mathematics;
- Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL.

### Non-year 12 applicants

- Satisfactory completion of at least one year of tertiary study in a relevant field; and
- Meets the VCE Maths and English requirement benchmarks.

Literacy and numeracy test: If VCE Maths and/or English requirements or equivalent have not been met, a Literacy and/or Numeracy assessment is required to demonstrate the pre-requisite requirements. Applicants required to complete the assessment will be notified.

### Admissions Criteria for applicants with a vocational education and training study

- Successful completion of a TAFE qualification at Certificate III or IV in a cognate or appropriate area, such as Community Services, Education Support, Children's Services, or Nursing; and
- At least one year of experience in a relevant area of education or support service and;
- Meets the VCE Maths and English requirement benchmarks.

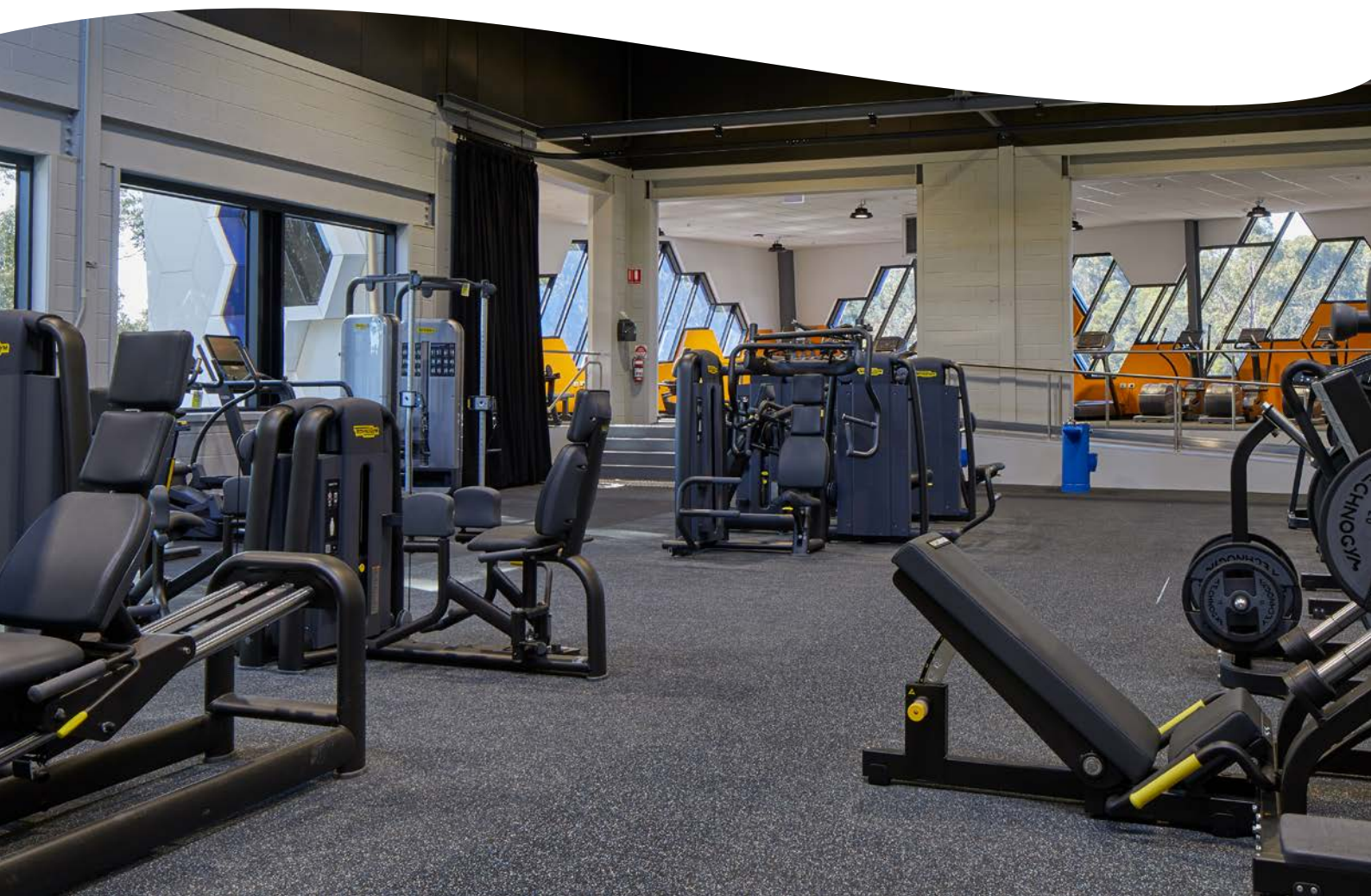
OR

- Successful completion of a recognised TAFE Diploma program in a cognate or an appropriate area and;
- Meets the VCE Maths and English requirement benchmarks.

Literacy and numeracy test: If VCE Maths and/or English requirements or equivalent have not been met, a Literacy and/or Numeracy assessment is required to demonstrate the pre-requisite requirements. Applicants required to complete the assessment will be notified.

### Admissions Criteria for applicants with work and life experience

Applicants who have not completed secondary education, or undertaken any TAFE or university studies should include a personal statement detailing all relevant work and life experience to strengthen their application.



## Take Altus

All applicants are required to complete Altus Suite as part of their application. Altus Suite is a requirement for many of the initial teacher training courses in Victoria. It is a non-cognitive online test designed to assess an applicant's personal and professional attributes.

Altus Suite consists of two-parts, however only the Casper component is compulsory for Federation University applications. To register for your sitting or for further information about the assessment, visit [www.TakeAltus.com](http://www.TakeAltus.com)

### Altus Suite:

#### Part One (Compulsory)

- Casper: 60-90 minute online, open-response situational judgment test (SJT)

#### Part Two (Recommended)

- Snapshot: 10-minute one-way video interview with standardised questions

*Completion of Snapshot is recommended but not compulsory for Federation University applications.*

We recommend booking your CASPer test in advance, so your application is not delayed. The fee to take CASPer is \$80 (AUD).

Applicants will be required to hold a valid Working with Children (WWC) Check prior to undertaking professional placements.

## Police record check

Applicants will be required to hold a valid National Police Record Check for professional placements.
